Recipe of the Month: Sorrel Pesto

A New Years treat for YOU for the post-holiday season!

What you need: 2 cups coarsely chopped fresh sorrel, ribs removed

1/3 cup packed fresh parsley leaves

2 garlic cloves, roughly chopped 1/3 cup freshly grated parmesan

1/4 cup pine nuts (optional)

1/2 teaspoon salt

1/4 cup olive oil

In a food processor or blender puree the sorrel, the parsley, the garlic, the parmesan, the pine nuts and the oil, transfer the pesto to a jar with a tight fitting lid and chill it, covered. The pesto keeps, covered and chilled, for 2 weeks. Makes about 1 cup.

Use the sorrel on pasta or fish for a spicy, decadent dish!

January 1st - 3rd

A Barren Time. Best For Killing Weeds, Briars, Poison Ivy, And Other Plant Pests. Clear Woodlots And Fencerows.

January 4 - 5th

Favorable Days For Planting Root Crops. Fine For Sowing Grains, Hay, And Forage Crops. Plant Flowers. January 6 - 7th

Plant Carrots, Turnips, Onions, Beets, Irish Potatoes, And Other Root Crops In The South. Lettuce, Cabbage, Collards And Other Leafy Vegetables Will Do Well. Start Seedbeds. Good Days For Transplanting.

Seeds Planted Now Will Grow Poorly And Yield Little January 10th - 11th

Favorable Planting Days: First Day Good For Planting Root Crops. Second Day Good For Aboveground Crops Such As Sweet Corn, Beans, And Peppers. January 12 - 13th

Good Time To Kill Plant Pests Or Do Plowing. Poor For Planting.

Fine For Planting Any Aboveground Crop Where The Climate Permits. Extra Good For Peppers, Tomatoes, Peas, And Other Vine Crops. January 17 - 18th

Barren Days. Do No Planting. January 19th - 21st

Fine For Planting Beans, Peppers, Cucumbers, Melons, And Other Aboveground Crop Where Climate Is Suitable.

January 22nd - 23rd

Poor Days For Planting. Seeds Tend To Rot In Ground.

Favorable Planting Days: First Two Days Are Best For Planting Aboveground Crops. Especially Good For Peas, Beans, Cucumber, And Squash. Last Day Is A Most Fruitful Time To Plant Beets, Carrots, Onions, And Other Hardy Root Crops. Also Good For Transplanting. January 27 - 30th

A Barren Time. Best For Killing Weeds, Briars, Poison Ivy, And Other Plant Pests. Clear Woodlots And Fencerows.

January 31st

Favorable Day For Planting Root Crops. Fine For Sowing Grains, Hay, And Forage Crops. Plant Flowers.

February 1st

TOP BAR BEEKEEPING 101...



Welcome to the wonderful, exciting, and delicious world of beekeeping!!

Jamaican honey is known throughout the world as being some of the most unique and tasty honey in the world thanks to our diverse plants, flowers, and crops. Beekeeping and honey production have a real opportunity to take off in the next five years, and it would be great if more organic farmers could be a part of it! Not to mention, honeybees are the best pollinators out there! So here is a brief introduction to the benefits of **Top Bar Hive** beekeeping!

There are two main hive options in beekeeping– Langstroth and Top Bar. Top Bar Hives are a low-cost, low-impact alternative to Langstroth hives. **Top Bar Hives** are self-contained beehives that better simulate a wild bee colony. Thus, they do not require equipment such as honey supers, extra frames, foundations, and hive tools that Langstroth Hives need. They also require less treatment of the bees– perfect for organics!

Top Bar Hives are much easier and safer to manage. Each honey comb is inspected individually, leaving the rest of the colony undisturbed and less likely to swarm or sting the beekeeper. Top Bar Hives are also perfect for youth, women, and older beekeepers because it does not require the lifting of heavy boxes.

February 7 - 8th

Any Root Crops That Can Be Planted Now Will Do Well.

February 9 - 11th

Barren Days. Fine For Clearing, Plowing, Fertilizing And Killing Plant Pests.

February 12 - 13th

Plant Peppers, Sweet Corn, Tomatoes, And Other Aboveground Crops In Southern Florida, California, And Texas. Extra Good For Cucumbers, Peas, Cantaloupes, And Other Vine Crops. Set Strawberry Plants. February 14 - 15th

Seeds Planted Now Will Grow Poorly And Yield Little.

February 19 - 20th

Any Seed Planted Now Will Tend To Rot. February 21st - 22nd

Fine For Planting Beans, Tomatoes, Corn, Cotton, Cucumbers, Peppers, Melons, And Other Aboveground Crops Where Climate Allows. Plant Seedbeds And Flower Gardens February 23rd - 26th

Clear Ground, Turn Sod. Kill Plant Pests. February 27 - 28th

Favorable Days For Planting Root Crops. Fine For Sowing Grains, Hay, And Forage Crops. Plant Flowers.
